Rebecca "Becky" Wylie, age 94, of Sugar Hill, GA passed away on Tuesday, February 22, 2022. She was preceded in death by her husband, Edward Wylie. Becky began her federal career in Washington, DC at the US Naval Observatory. In 1957 she moved to San Francisco and worked for the National Academy of Sciences. In 1962, Becky joined CDC as a statistician in the Medical Laboratory Section of the Division of Chemistry, Hematology, and Pathology.

Becky, was CDC's longest serving employee, having retired in January 2021 with 58 years of service. She spent the last 17 years of her career within the Division of Communication Services (DCS), Office of the Associate Director for Communication.

Becky loved her work, her family, her co-workers and last but not least, animals of any kind. She often commented that she had been very lucky in life and blessed with excellent health.
