He especially cherished his six precious grandchildren who fondly remember him by his silly jokes and sayings. Their presence brought him so much joy and laughter, which encouraged him in his final days as they gathered by his bedside in Suwanee, GA, where he recently relocated this year with Faye.

Faith and family were Alan's greatest joys. His strongest desire was to bring people to know Christ, and he also actively sought to encourage non-active members to return to church. He was a faithful member of the Lutheran

Upon retirement, he enjoyed watching the Chicago White Sox win the World Series as he was not only a fan, but had also spent the majority of his youth and young adulthood playing baseball.
