Beverly (Bev) Francis Mitchell, 81 of Flowery Branch, GA passed away Sunday, March 8, 2026 at a local hospital after a brief illness of pancreatic cancer. A funeral service will be held on March 21, 2026 in Woodstock, VA with burial at Massanutten Cemetery immediately following.

Mr. Mitchell served the transportation profession for his entire life in various capacities with both public transportation departments and private consulting firms. Over his career he designed, constructed, and operated traffic control systems throughout the country. His broad experience and practical approach to problems solving was valued by many organizations that he served.

Mr. Mitchell was born December 14, 1944, in Roanoke, VA. He is preceded in death by his parents and two brothers.
