Jimmie and Catherine loved and supported each other for forty-three years. Catherine was a retired New York City Marshal. She held that Mayoral appointed position for twenty-two years. She built a successful business collecting judgments owed to the New York City Department of Finance, various corporations, attorneys and private individuals. Prior to her appointment as a Marshal, Catherine was a legal assistant for the firm of Lipkowitz and Plaut in New York City. Jimmie and Catherine lived in Queens until retiring in 2007 and moving to Georgia.
