It is with deep sadness and loving remembrance that we announce the passing of Cecil Cardinal Chung, affectionately known as "Ces" and "Mr. C.," on June 4, 2026, at the age of 76.

After a courageous journey with Parkinson's disease, Cecil passed peacefully at his home in Suwanee, Georgia, surrounded by his loving family. His earthly journey has ended, but his gentle spirit and enduring love will remain forever in the hearts of those who knew him. A child of God, Cecil now rests in eternal peace.

Born in Old Harbour, Jamaica, West Indies, Cecil moved to London, England, at the age of eleven to join his parents, Inez Reid, née Perry, and Samuel Chung who are now deceased, and begin a new chapter in life.

Throughout his years, he was known for his quiet strength, kind heart, thoughtful nature, and genuine humility. He never sought the spotlight, yet his wisdom, generosity, and steady presence touched countless lives. Whether tending a garden, preparing a meal for loved ones, or relaxing by the sea, Cecil found joy in life's simple blessings.

One of life's greatest gifts to Cecil was meeting Judith, the love of his life and his devoted partner of fifty years. Their story began when a mutual friend, Winsome, suggested he meet "a nice young lady" living nearby in England. What began as a simple introduction blossomed into a beautiful marriage filled

with friendship, laughter, mutual respect, and unwavering love. Together, they built a life rich in faith, family, and cherished memories, welcoming two children, Andrea and Stephen, who remained the pride and joy of their lives. Cecil possessed an extraordinary love of learning and a curiosity that never faded. As a young man in London, he would spend summer afternoons on the rooftop of his family home reading the dictionary from beginning to end, fascinated by the endless possibilities of knowledge. Encouraged by his chemistry teacher, Mr. Mata, he pursued higher education with determination and earned:

- Bachelor of Science in Chemistry, University of Surrey, Guildford, England
- Postgraduate Teaching Certificate, Goldsmiths College, London, England
- Bachelor of Science in Computer Science, Florida International University, Miami, Florida

His love for Jamaica remained close to his heart throughout his life. In 1973, he returned home to teach Chemistry at Clarendon College. Shortly after in 1977, they welcomed their firstborn, Andrea, and taught at Excelsior Community College in Kingston, Jamaica. Teaching allowed him to share his passion for learning while helping shape the futures of young minds.

In 1980, Cecil and Judith immigrated to Miami, Florida, where they continued building their life together. The arrival of their son Stephen in 1984 completed their family and brought even greater joy to their home. As a husband and father, Cecil was dependable, patient, and deeply loving. He led not through words alone, but through his example—showing integrity, kindness, humility, and dedication in everything he did.

After earning his degree in Computer Science, Cecil embarked on a successful career in Information Technology, a field he had long dreamed of exploring. His career began at Racal-Milgo in Miami, Florida and later led him to Scientific-Atlanta in Lawrenceville, Georgia, where he served as an IT Business Applications Analyst. Following the acquisition of Scientific-Atlanta by Cisco Systems, Cecil continued his distinguished career there until retirement.

Throughout his professional life, Cecil earned the respect and admiration of his colleagues.

As an IT Professional, IT Business Analyst, Program Manager and a Project Manager with focus in SAP R3 he supported operations across the United States, Canada, Mexico, and Europe.

His work took him to many places, but no matter where he traveled, he always looked forward to returning home to Judith, family, and friends. He loved recreating recipes he discovered abroad, and delighted all with his cooking. Above all else, Cecil treasured his family. He celebrated their successes, supported them through challenges, and loved them unconditionally. His quiet encouragement, gentle humor, and warm presence were gifts that will be remembered forever.
