Charles (Chuck) David McQuay, age 92, passed away peacefully on Sunday, October 21, 2018 in Buford, Georgia after a long illness. Born in Wheeling, WVA, Chuck graduated from Wheeling High School in 1945 and was drafted into the Armed Services upon graduation and received an honorable discharge 12/10/1946.
