From mudding in a jeep, sitting on a ramp watching him ride his bike, driving in his car, wondering neighborhoods, and just holding his hand. He was my first male best friend and someone who I would continue a friendship with for over a decade afterwards. Cory was the first boy I loved, and my two favorite memories are as follows: one night many moons ago I was in my bedroom. My room was in the basement and my window was frequently visited by many, but on this night I was talking to him on the phone. He told me that he had loaned some tools the boy down the street and that they were going to be returned to me to deliver to him the following day.
