“ Sunday, I heard that my Aunt Evelyn died. She had been on Hospice, and this was not totally unexpected. However, death has a weight of finality. When someone you love dies, one gets the feeling that the world should stop – take a solemn moment – remember one who has walked this earth serving Jesus and touched our lives. I’d like to honor my Aunt Evelyn with a brief reflection. Words cannot capture the fullness of her life. She gave birth to three children and ‘mothered’ many more, including me. For the majority of my first 17 years, we lived near or in the same neighborhood. Ed, Fred, and Bob were my best friends, from Beckley, West Virginia to Bristol, Virginia. At one point, Aunt Evelyn, Aunt Doris, and my family lived in Chester Hills, Bristol, Virginia - 25 feet apart.

We had so many memorable meals together, where we always congregated to visit. While the kitchen was memorable, it did not define the extent of her accomplishments. She was the one teaching us how to have faith in our Lord, how to be content with what we had with grace, and know there would be opportunities for a better life, if we work hard and kept our eyes on God’s will for us. She was the discipline and teacher for “The Sharretts” singing ministry. Too often it seemed we had to stop playing in “The Pines” so Ed, Fred, and Bob would have to practice singing. Aunt Evelyn was also our family barber. All of us guys would line up so Aunt Evelyn could shear all 4 of our heads, to save us the cost of a barber.

The Word says: "We fix our eyes not on what is seen, but what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." 2 Corinthians 4:18.

Going through a crisis is where sound theology meets reality. I have an answer to the question we are asked when we lose someone very precious to us., “How are you doing?” My theology enables me to face reality and guides me to find my “new normal”. Having lost my mom and sister recently, life is still hard at times. I still experience feeling lonely and sad, and wish things were different. Knowing and serving God personally, produces stability and peace. I have an assurance that things happened according to His Plan. While these memories make it obvious why I think the world should
