“ Inez was a year younger than her sister, who was my mother, Loray; but Mother always looked up to Inez as the prettier, smarter, wiser, and more queenly one. I appreciated both of them, for Inez was like a second mother to me. She made me feel as loved as her own daughters.

Staying a week with Inez's family was the highlight of my every summer; it was a mini-course in homemaking and socialization. From stringing beans and shucking corn under the shade of the carport to late-night giggles followed by stern reprimands, life at her home was picture-perfect to me. Inez gave the best haircuts, kept an immaculate house, and served up the most luscious home-cooked meals. She was a queen of creamed corn!

Inez was also a queen of gorgeous quilts, especially the stained-glass masterpiece she stitched carefully for several years. As she aged and was no longer able to do such meticulous work, she used her eye for detail to become a puzzle-working queen. Because her mind and memory were still sharp, every detail about her family mattered to her - she was a queen of concern and compassion. I think her love and desire for her family is well expressed in III John 2:2 & 4, "I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. . . I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." Inez demonstrated that a life lived by the principles in God's Word is a life that is stable, strong, joyful, and beautiful.

I will miss Inez and hearing her clear, sweet, loving voice saying, "Well, hey, Vickie!" Whether reminiscing about Mother and their childhood, sharing scripture, or giving me tidbits of advice on everything from cake icing to flower maintenance, she was a treasure-trove of practical wisdom gleaned from 95 years of living.
