



## Jeptha Reuben Murray

March 20, 1924 - June 23, 2020

Jeptha Reuben Murray, 96, of Decatur, Georgia passed away on June 23, 2020 after a heart attack. He was called J.R. or Jep by family and friends. J.R. was born on March 20, 1924 to Sara Caroline (Good) and Henry Bascomb Murray in Berryton, Georgia. After graduating from Lafayette (GA) High School in 1941, he served in the Army Air Force from 1943 to 1946 as an airplane engine mechanic and was honorably discharged. As a Corporal, he was awarded the American Theater Service Ribbon, the Good Conduct Medal, and the WWII Victory Medal. He went on to study Animal Husbandry at Auburn University.

After graduation, he began his career with Ford Tractor Division performing field trials of Ford tractors, moving on to Minneapolis Moline, and Goodyear Tire as Regional Service Supervisor.

In 1950, he met Vicie Sheppard, and they wed in 1952, going on to have 3 children, Donald Edwin, Karen, and John Scot.

After retiring in 1981, J.R. spent his time with travel, family, and friends. He helped many to build and expand their homes. He was caretaker for sister Irene, and friend Dorothy Bryan. He loved every Fitts, Huntington, Kornfeld, and Kennedy. Thank You to all that touched his journey.

J.R. was preceded in death by his parents, Sara and Henry Murray; wife, Vicie K. Sheppard Murray; sisters, Irene and Lorene; and brother, Paul. J.R. is survived by all of his children, Donald, Karen Murray Craig (Myles), and John Scot; grandchildren, Alyssa C. Craig and Joshua M. Craig; and great-

grandchild, Mason Craig.
