



## Lt. Col. John Edward Marder

April 8, 1920 - August 13, 2020

John Edward Marder, age 100, of Lawrenceville, GA passed away Thursday, August 13, 2020. Mr. Marder was born on April 8, 1920 in Kearny, NJ to parents Edward Marder and Alice Wade. He was a 1937 graduate of St. Rose High School in Belmar, NJ. Lt. Col. Marder retired from the United States Air Force after twenty-eight years of service and was a veteran of World War II serving as a pilot on B-25 missions in the south pacific. He retired from E.I. 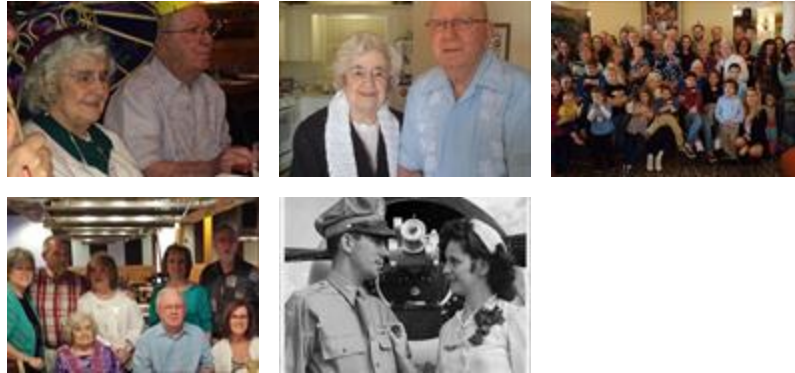
