Joseph Edward Gomez, age 85, of Flowery Branch, GA passed away on Friday, November 2, 2018. He was preceded in death by his wife of fifty-eight years, RoseAnn Gomez. Mr. Gomez was born October 10, 1933 in New York. He was a veteran of the U. S. Army. He worked as a security advisor for U. S. Customs and Waterfront Commission in Newark, NJ. Mr. Gomez retired from McRoberts Security Company in New Jersey. Known to many as "Coach" or "Mr. G," Joseph and his American Legion team of allstar players made it to the championships several years consecutively. He also formed the Goshen Youth League with a group of parents in the 1970's so the youth of Goshen would have sports in their town. Mr. Gomez was loved by many.
