SUGAR HILL, Ga. - Lari Jean (Bachman) Webster, 75, passed into the arms of Jesus on Friday, March 22, 2019, at Seasons Hospice in Cumming, Ga., after a long battle with cancer. She fought valiantly until the end and was surrounded by the love of her life, Gary and her adoring daughters. We are confident that she is now fully healed and stands face to face and hand in hand with Jesus. She shared her birthday with Jesus and while her faith was subtle in her words, it was unquestionable in her soul.

Lari was born Dec. 25, 1943, to Clark H. Bachman and Constance (Whitesell) Bachman in Hopkinsville, Ky. She was the first of four children, and she spent most of her life in Georgia, including Albany, Ga., and the Atlanta area. She was a long time resident of Sugar Hill Georgia. She spent many years in the residential property management business and later retired from Sprint Communications.

She was married to her soulmate Gary Lewis Webster for 44 years. Family gatherings were her absolute favorite and spent with the entire family gathered around the house eating, dancing, playing cards and celebrating our many blessings.
