Mary O'Sullivan, 82, of St. Simon's Island, Georgia passed away December 24, 2013 with her family by her side. Mary was born on July 1, 1931 to the late Catherine and Jack Sarsfield in Bronx, New York. She married the late John James O'Sullivan on June 27, 1952. They lived in Bergenfield, New Jersey for 5 years, before moving to Rockland County, New York, where they lived for 15 years. After John retired, they moved to St. Simon's Island. Together they raised 5 children. She is predeceased by her brother, James Sarsfield and her sister Kathleen Scarpetta.

Mary received a Bachelors Degree in Psychology from Dominican College in Blauvelt New York, then went on to earn her Master's in Social Work at Fordham University in New York City. She practiced as a clinical social worker from 1976 until 1998 when she retired.

Over the years Mary was very active in the Prolife Movement" She was a representative for the Brunswick/Valdosta Deanery. She volunteered with the St. Vincent DePaul and Manna House. Her

favorite ministry was visiting inmates at the Jesup Federal Correctional Facility. She worked with them for 15 years. Prior to that ministry, she worked for 10 years at the Woman's House of Detention in Brunswick, Georgia. She always showed kindness and acceptance to those in need.

Mary has been an active member of St. Williams Catholic Church for 38 years. She always had a deep devotion to Mary. She made a pilgrimage to Medjugore and also visited Knock in Ireland. She had a spirituality and deeply held faith that never wavered, but served her well throughout her lifetime.

Mary is survived by her 5 children; Maryann O'Sullivan, Jeanne O'Mahony, of California, John (Cathy) O'Sullivan of Miami, Tom {Janine} O'Sullivan and Liz (Donal) O'Donovan of Atlanta. She is also survived by 17 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Memorial mass will be held at St. Williams Catholic Church, St. Simon's Island on Friday, December 27, 2013 at 10:00 a.m.
