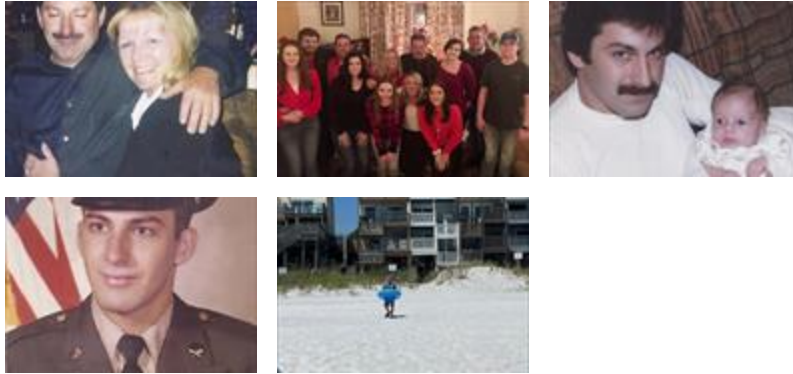
Go fly high Mick, your work on earth is done.
