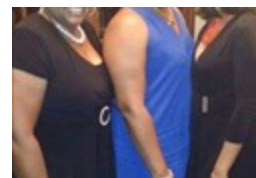

Natalie "Margarine/Nats" Moodie was a unique gem. One that could never be duplicated or compared to any other. She was beautiful and special.

It's not hard to speak about her. What's hard is to stop, as there are so many memories to share which makes it challenging to be concise.

After meeting Natalie in 1999 we were like glue AND any surface - we just stuck together. She was integral in the Kirkvine Sports Club Netball Team participating in their first international netball tournament in Miami, FL that same year and my first time ever traveling overseas. She knew precisely how to get things done and was an awesome planner. Perfection was her target. She was an all-rounder and any position she played, she was effective. She knew how to turn the game around for victory.

Natalie was one of the best female drivers ever! Whether bicycle, motor car, tractor or trailer, you name it, she drove it without fear.

Her laughs could shatter any glass - very loud and strong. Her singing was another story - high pitched and offkey, yet she sang with confidence. Despite my ear aching, I had to endure listening to "I believe" and "You Say" on numerous occasions, whether via phone or in person.

She was a great cook. She loved food. She ate practically everything. She knew my likes and dislikes and so whenever I visited she would have my favourite meal and dessert prepared and ready for me.

No matter how long I stayed with her, it was always short.

In our second to last conversation, we argued about my next visit. She

demanded that I returned in August. I indicated that I wouldn't be able to. She was displeased but I promised her I'd visit in November. She asked if I'd spend Christmas too. I said yes, knowing this was not true. In our last conversation, she advised me that she was at the airport. I asked her why. She said, waiting on me. I told her to stay right there and wait, she'd soon see me... I guess she waited in vain (sad)
