He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science at the Inter-American University in Puerto Rico.

He went on to be self-employed as an IT contractor for government agencies in Puerto Rico. Then was offered an IT position for Gwinnett County, where he worked for ten years. He was currently employed with Southern Company as a system analyst in their IT Department.
