In civilian life, he became an electronics instructor at the Denver Institute of Technology (Denver, CO) for one year until moving to Georgia to accept a

position as a Metrology Engineer at Rockwell International's Missile Systems Division, Duluth. Rockwell management's recognition of his leadership skills rapidly elevated him to Metrology Section Supervisor. During the final twelve years of his professional life, Pat became a high-performing Technical Sales Representative with Sun Force, a test equipment integration contractor to the Air Force. In his free time, Pat enjoyed watching movies and could always be counted-on to provide a funny quote, complete with a character's voice, that would fit any moment.
