Professor Thomas Wylie Davis passed away on Friday, January 12, 2018 in Atlanta, GA. T. Wylie received his BA from Emory University where he was a member of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity. After graduating from Emory he joined the United States Army as a member of the Intelligence Corp. When his tour of duty was complete, he continued his education at Boston University achieving a MFA. He began his career as a Special Education Art teacher in NYC and went on to be a Professor of Art at UGA, and later an art instructor at Emory University and most recently worked for Tutoring Solutions of Atlanta. T. Wylie was a founding member of Atlanta Prime Timers. He is survived by his sister, Dot Davis Hartsfield; nephew, Reid Hartsfield; and niece, Wrece Hartsfield Mazur. At T. Wylie's request there will be no memorial service.
