“ *Suzan- we met in Scottsdale when Walter came back to arrange your move from Arizona. Walter and I went to grade school at North School until his family moved out in the country on Rand Rd. We were in school again at Arlington Heights Township High School. He jumped a year ahead as he skipped a year at the one room grade school he attended. He was my best friend in grade school. We and his family attended the Presbyterian Church in Arlington Heights. His father was a long distance truck driver who never seemed to home. I think they had either 9 or 10 children. Whenever we had church dinner and there was food left over, it was taken to the Page's house. We were all poor at that time. Walter took me out to Rolling Green Country Club the first time and many other times to carry golf bags. He did not have a bike but his was bigger and stronger so he had me sit on the middle bar while he operated the bike. We got 90 cents for 18 holes-about 4hours work and were very happy to get it. I think I made about \$25 that summer. I could and will later send you more info. I still have your Christmas card from last year when he said he expected that to be his last due to his illness. I tried to find your phone number several times, but I am having a few health and memory problems myself. We are both well. We drove to Alaska again last May. I am so sorry to have gotten this notice, but I had my sister look up a bunch of old friends and she told me about Walter. Best wishes. Don Havranek. Still 50 years same house.*
